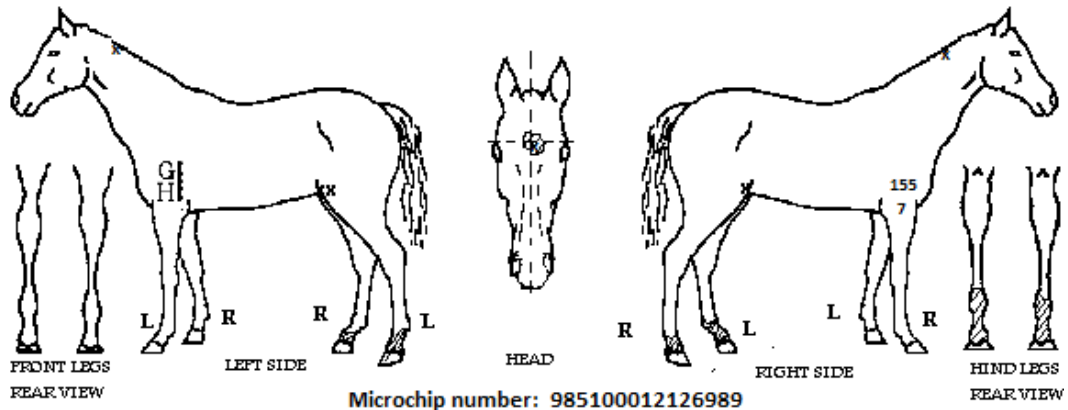

EXAMINATION REPORT



A veterinary examination of the 2yo bay thoroughbred filly **Jemss** standing approximately 16 hands 1" described in the above diagram was carried out at David Payne's stables on June 17, 2020. At the time of examination, the horse was approximately one month into her current race preparation.

Clinical Examination:

The horse was presented in good condition and in good clinical health. On examination the horse was generally well conformed, and had a quiet temperament. There were no abnormalities detected on auscultation of the heart and lungs. The horse appeared to be sound when examined at the walk and trot in hand and after being subjected to flexion tests. A physical examination did not reveal any obvious signs of injury or abnormal wear. The hooves were in good condition, and were shod in steel shoes.

Endoscopic Examination:

An endoscopic examination of the upper respiratory tract was conducted at rest. Laryngeal function was assessed as grade 1 according to Lane's classification, and there were no structural or functional abnormalities of the larynx, epiglottis, soft palate, or pharynx detected.

Breeding Examination:

The breeding examination was confined to physical examination of the external genitalia and manual rectal examination of the ovaries and uterus due to the facilities available in the racing stable. The vulva was normal in conformation but had been Caslicked as it is a routine procedure for this racing stable. The teats and udder were also considered to be normal on examination and palpation. The ovaries, uterine horns and body and cervix were palpably normal for a 2yo mare in seasonal anoestrus.
