History and Clinical Exam

Not So Common raced on Wednesday 17th May at Ipswich (heavy 10) over 1200m finishing 3rd of 8. A vet examination following the race reported him to be "short striding in both forelimbs". The following day, the colt was evaluated for lameness. He was grade 2/5 lame in the right fore (where grade 1 is mildly lame and grade 5 is non weight bearing lame). Carpal flexion transiently exacerbated the lameness. There was a mild effusion of mid-carpal joints in both knees. Other flexion tests were unremarkable.

Lameness Exam

A nerve block to the mid-carpal joint of the RF caused the colt to switch to a grade 1/5 left forelimb lameness at 5 mins. Subsequently radiographs of both knees were obtained.

Radiographs

Right knee – Sclerosis extending deep into the distal radial carpal bone and sclerosis of third carpal bone.

Left knee – Sclerosis of radial facet and minor lysis of intermediate facet of third carpal bone.

Comments

Not So Common would benefit from a spell to allow for bony remodelling and repair. Dr Leanne Begg has been forwarded a copy of the knee radiographs. Please refer to Dr Leanne Begg for recommendations for treatment and management of this case.
